

The 2018 Bais Bay Medical Mission, a Negrense project in partnership with the Foundation for Philippine Medical Missions (FPMM), the province of Negros Oriental and the Local Government Units of Mabinay, Manjuyod, Bais, Tanjay & Pamplona (otherwise known as the MAMA BATA PA Inter-Local Health Zone), brought home the biggest medical mission in the history of our province last February 11-17, 2018. The mission provided free & quality medical, surgical, dental and ophthalmic care to thousands of residents in the area. The mission also donated medical supplies and equipment to Bais District Hospital and the Rural Health Centers of MAMA BATA PA.

Feeling the "hibernation mode" slow down our metabolism, we were grateful to Salih "Pong" Ututalum and Ricardo "Dokie" Solamillo who introduced us to the beauty of biking/cycling in Minnesota. (This city is full of beautiful bike trails year-round that should be taken advantage of!) The **Negrenses MN Sikad** was then revived and since then, 4 years after, the group has continued to pedal the trails, single tracks and city streets of Minnesota. Highlights of the Sikad group include the yearly **Tour De Hugo** which ranges from the least mileage of 20 miles to as long as the Century Ride (we are not yet at that level). We are proud to share though that we have Negrense kids who were able to finish the 20 miler on their first ride. The group has also joined the Tour de Shoreview 2 years back and some members tried out the Minneapolis Bike tour as well. Other paved trails the group frequents are the Gateway Trail to Stillwater, Cannon Valley trail to Red Wing, Root River Trail to Lanesboro and occasional City rides across the Stone Arch Bridge or around Lakes Phalen, Johanna, Harriet, Island, Turtle or Snail Lakes. Wanting to keep the blood flowing amongst our fellow Negrenses, we also have other sports activities which include Single Track Mountain Biking at Elm Creek, Carver Lake, Lake Rebecca, Theodore Wirth, Lebanon Hills and Cuyuna. Aside from biking, we also have mixed Volleyball either on grass near the New Brighton area or on sand at Island Lake. Last 2015, the SU Volleyball Team Damana joined the CSFA Outdoor mixed Volleyball tournament and garnered a trophy as Silver Champions. Lastly, we also have Soccer. Our Soccer Team meets up every Thursday to play with other teams also by Hazelnut Park at New Brighton. We encourage one and all to get into/back into sports. We hope to keep the blood flowing within and outside our group for as they always say: "health is wealth".
